Subject: Parking at Homewood

As you conclude the summer and get ready to return to JHU for another challenging and fun year, many of you will be faced with an undesirable challenge – parking your vehicle near the Homewood campus. The Baltimore City Parking Authority has installed multi-space parking meters along most of the formerly free parking spaces in the nearby community. Specifically, several hundred free parking spaces along North Charles St., University Parkway, St. Paul Street and many side streets now have time limitations on parking ranging from two hours to ten hours, and current rates are 50 cents per hour.

Regardless, many of you will still choose to bring a car with you. We would like to inform you of some campus parking options should you wish to avoid the daily battle to find a parking space and pay the proper amount.

The San Martin Garage is located on the west side of campus, less than a ten minute walk from most of campus and from many of the apartment buildings along the perimeter. The garage is available for \$320 per semester on a first-come, first-served basis. The garage is entered from Wyman Park Drive, down a scenic driveway now known as Carnegie Way. Access is 24/7, and this is a great option for those wishing to store their vehicles overnight.

Additionally, a limited number of permits will be sold each semester for parking in the 115 West University open-air garage for 24/7 access. Access is from San Martin Drive and University Parkway. Permits are \$320 per semester.

Finally, a convenient daytime (6 a.m. - 10 p.m.) parking option is the Homewood Field lot, accessed from University Parkway and conveniently located next to Homewood Field and the Athletic Center. While overnight parking is not permitted in this lot, daytime permits will be offered for \$320 per semester.

Alternatively, daily parking rates on campus vary from \$5 per day in the San Martin Garage to \$8 per day in the North Visitor Lot to \$12 per day in the Decker Garage. Multi-space meters are being installed in faculty parking areas for evenings and weekends for those wishing to park close to buildings after 3:45 p.m. Hourly rates will be posted on the meters.

If you would like to register for any of the semester parking passes described above, please visit <http://www.parking.jhu.edu> and select "Register for Undergraduate Parking Permit." We ask you to provide:

Name, J-card number (beginning with 601), vehicle info including: tag/plate number, make and model, e-mail address, phone number(s), parking preference and payment method.

Acceptable payment methods are credit card, cash, and check. Registrations will be confirmed via e-mail prior to September 1, 2007, once payment is received. At this point, online payments are not accepted, so payment via credit card can be completed by calling the Parking Office at (410) 516-PARK after the registration has been submitted.
